II. NEW BUSINESS

A. Financial & Operational Reports

1. Status of Accounts – February 2022

Dirk Verhoeff reviewed the status of accounts for February 2022. Dirk mentioned that the GRANTS line number need to be moved to the RECYCLING REVENUE line. All revenue line items were above budget with the exception of Landfill Gas and Miscellaneous Revenue. Dirk pointed out that there have been no encumbrances from the Leachate Transportation and Disposal line item because City of Dalton Finance has been applying it to the utilities line item. Dirk has requested the finance department to correct the error.

2. MBS eConnectDirect user Agreement

Dirk Verhoeff and Rob Estes presented a user agreement from Multibank Securities, Inc. that provides a platform for accessing market information, selecting CD's and bond offerings, and managing investment options. Dirk

3. Rainfall Report

Dirk Verhoeff reviewed the rainfall data through February 18, 2022. Dirk reported that we received 179% of normal rainfall in February and currently at 52% of normal for March.

1. Cell 6 Construction Update

Seth Lassitter provided a progress update for the Phase 6 Cell 6 landfill construction. ACC will be providing the draft construction drawings and E&S Plan drawings on Friday for review. The receipt of drainage material is a little behind schedule but the hauler can put more trucks on the project as needed. Mr. Dunn asked what quarry the material was coming from. Dirk responded that the material was coming from Paulding County.

2. Landfill Gas Project

Dirk Verhoeff informed the board that Trinseo has contacted him to discuss any options for the Authority to provide landfill gas to Trinseo. A meeting has been scheduled, and Dirk will update the Board at the next meeting.

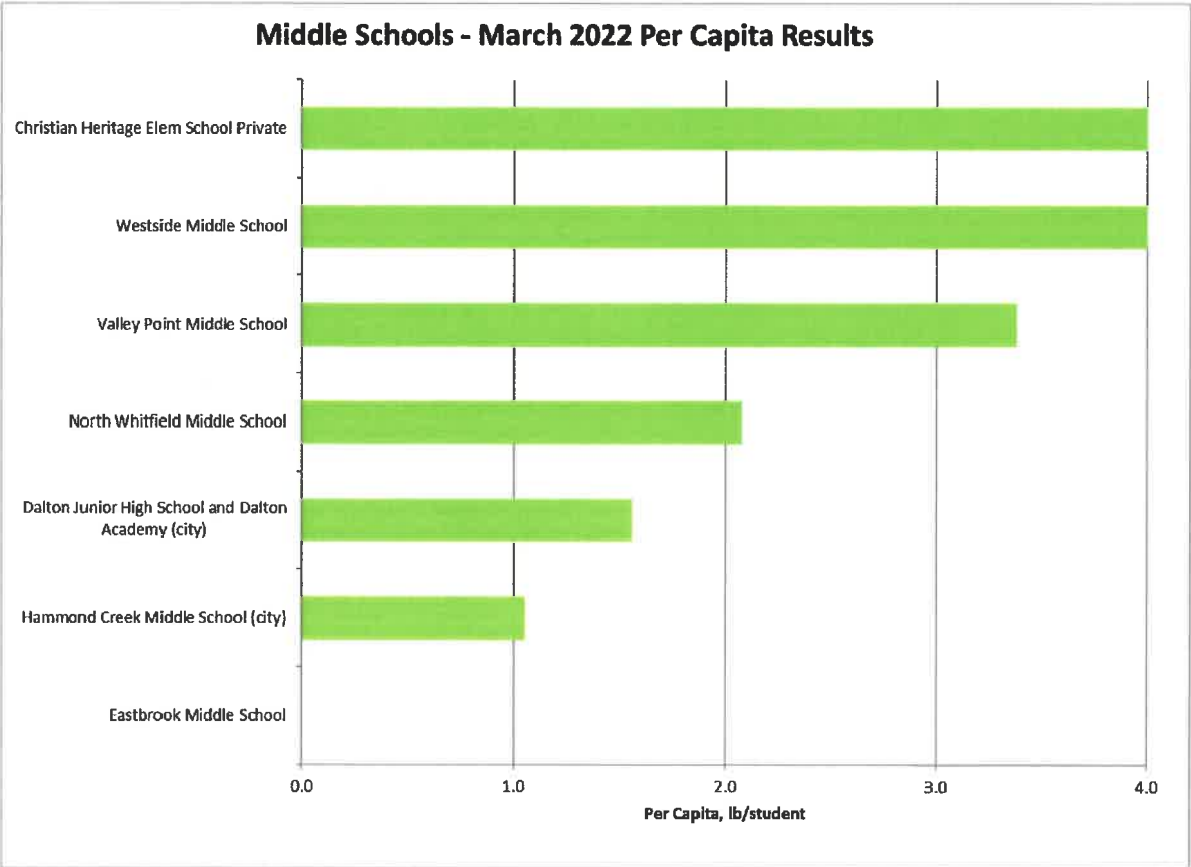
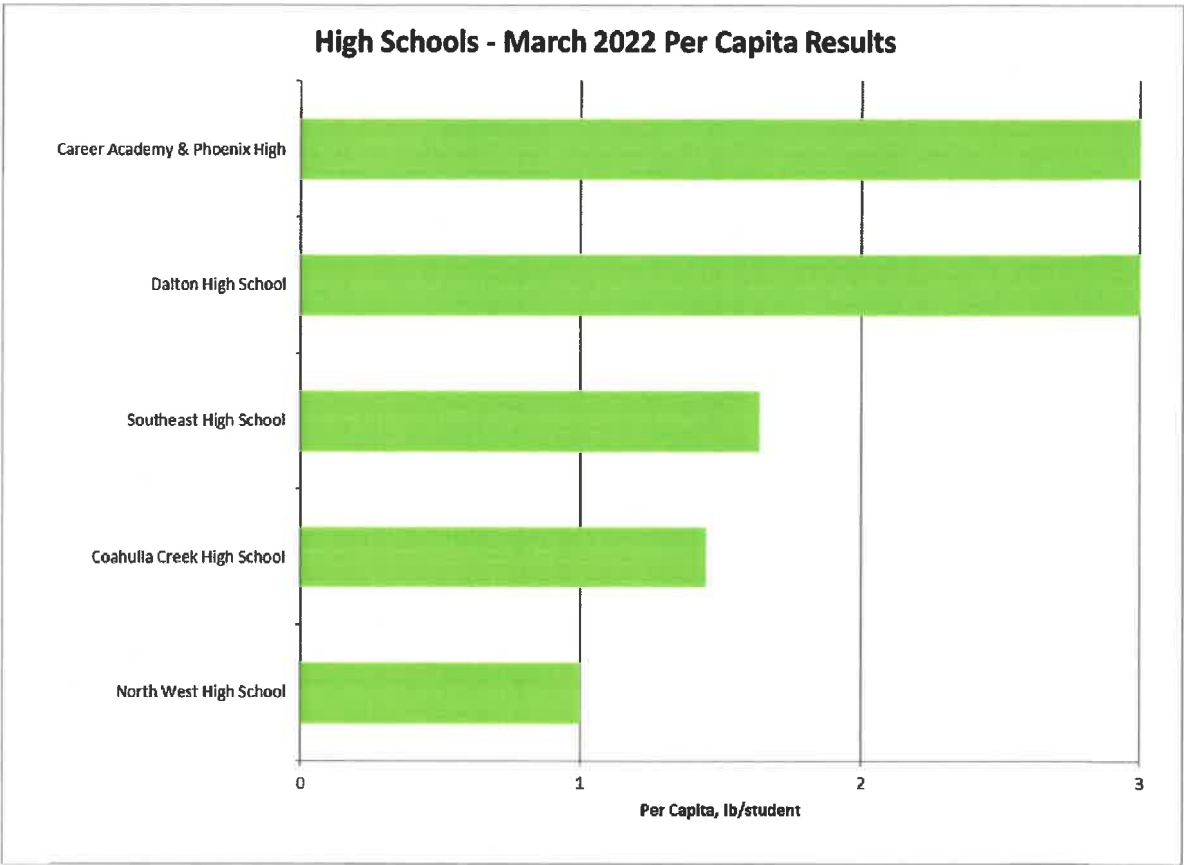

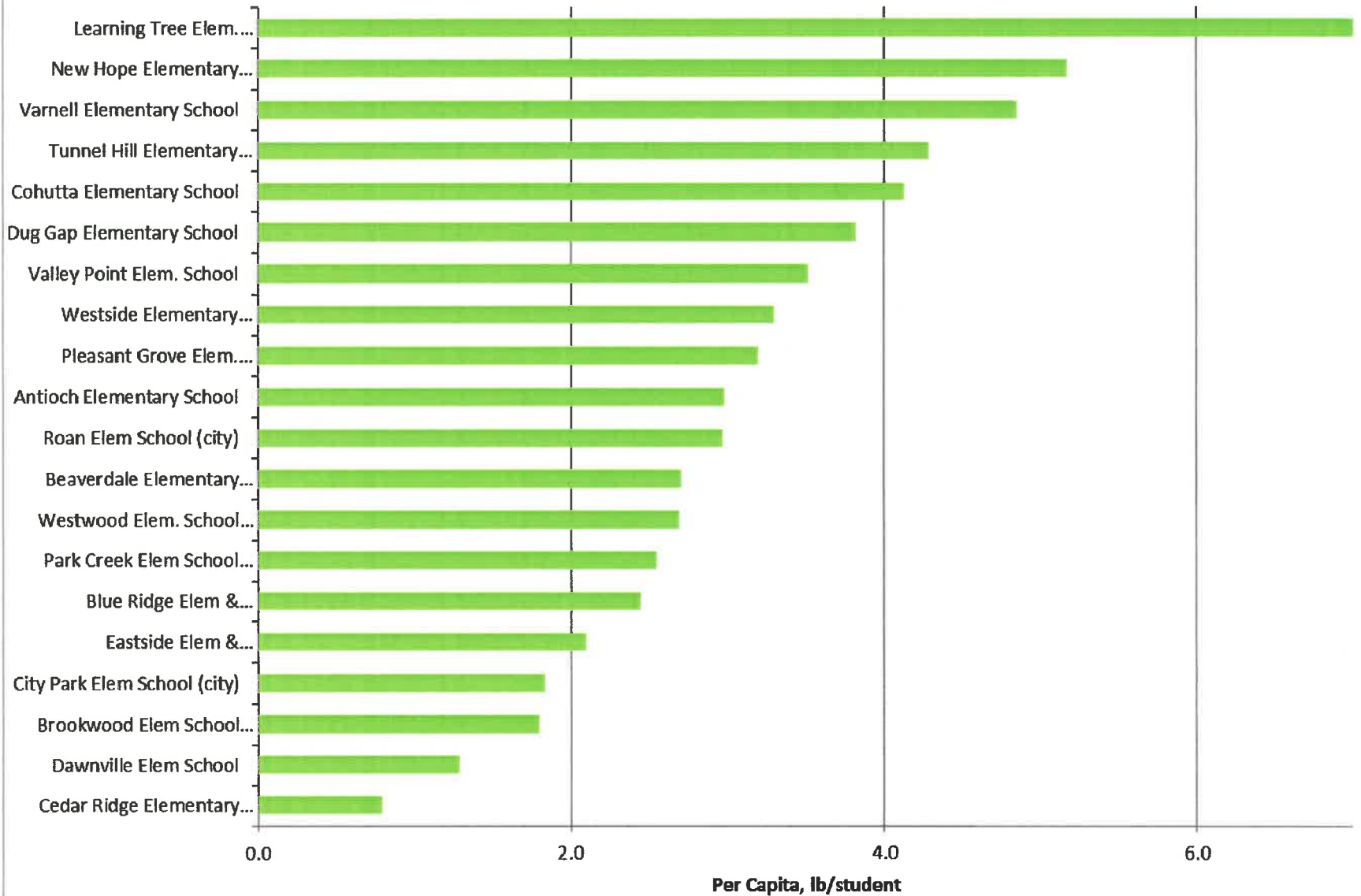

During this school year we had an 8-month contest period from August 2021 to March 2022. Schools competed in one of 3 categories: Elementary Schools, Middle Schools, and High Schools. Schools competed against students of the same age and now have the chance to receive recognition before the end of the school year.

During this contest period 34 participating schools collected 411,270 pounds of recyclable materials, mostly paper, for an average of 18.68 pounds recycled per student. That's the weight equivalent of about 117 hippos and saves 343 cubic yards of landfill space.

Congratulations to the following seven schools for being part of the top recycling schools for this year! Recycling center staff will be contacting you regarding a prize. Certificates of recognition will be mailed.

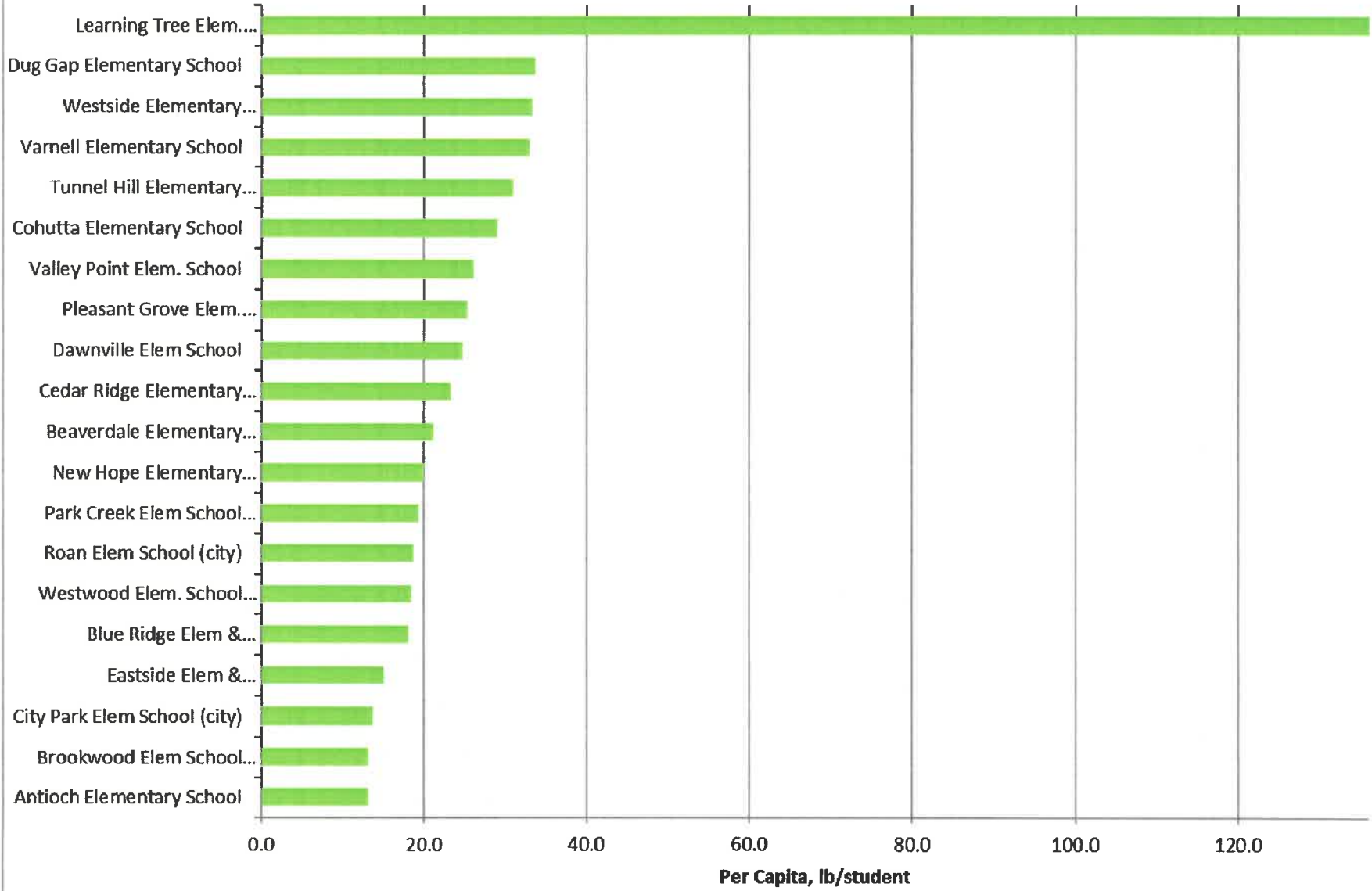

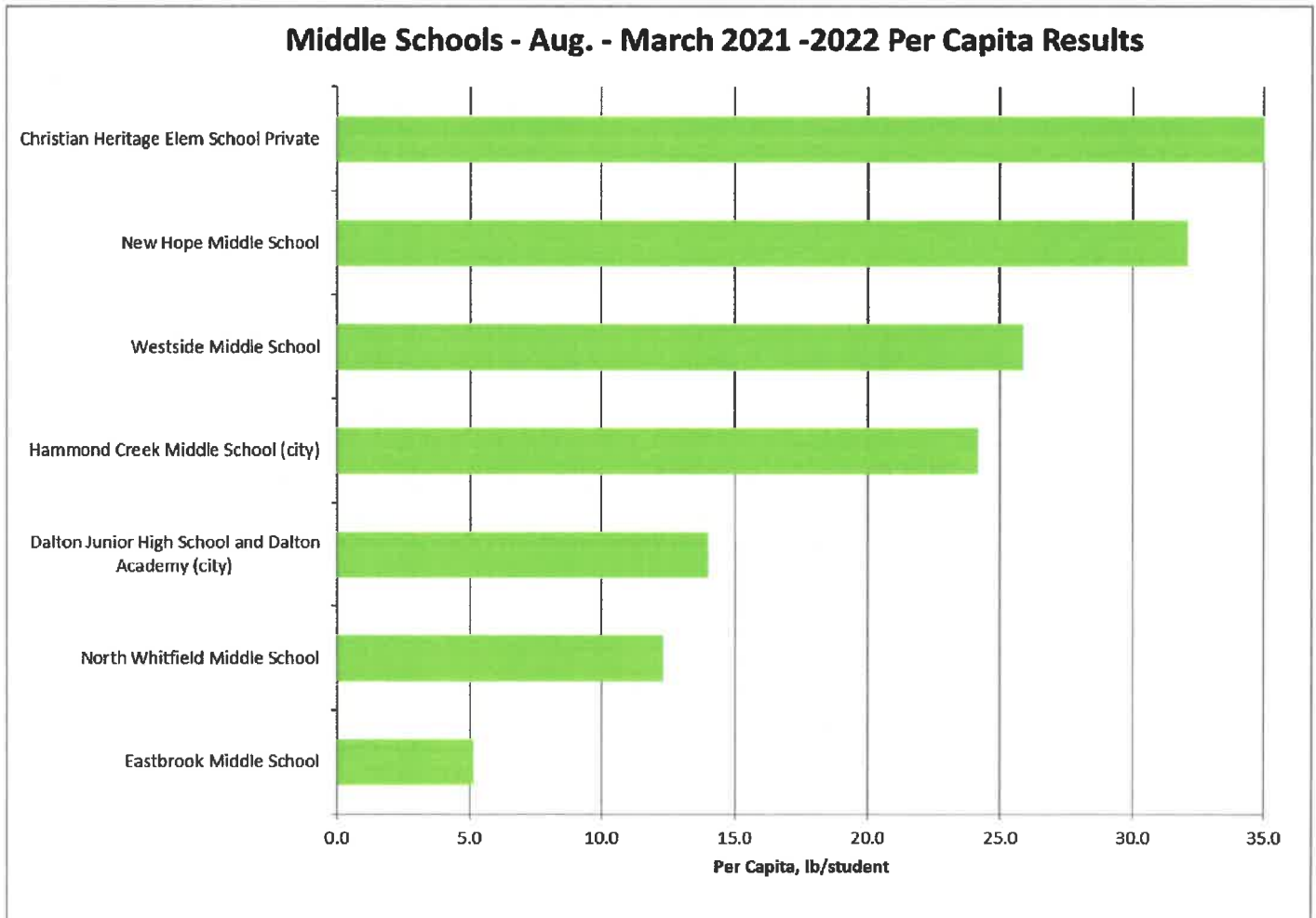

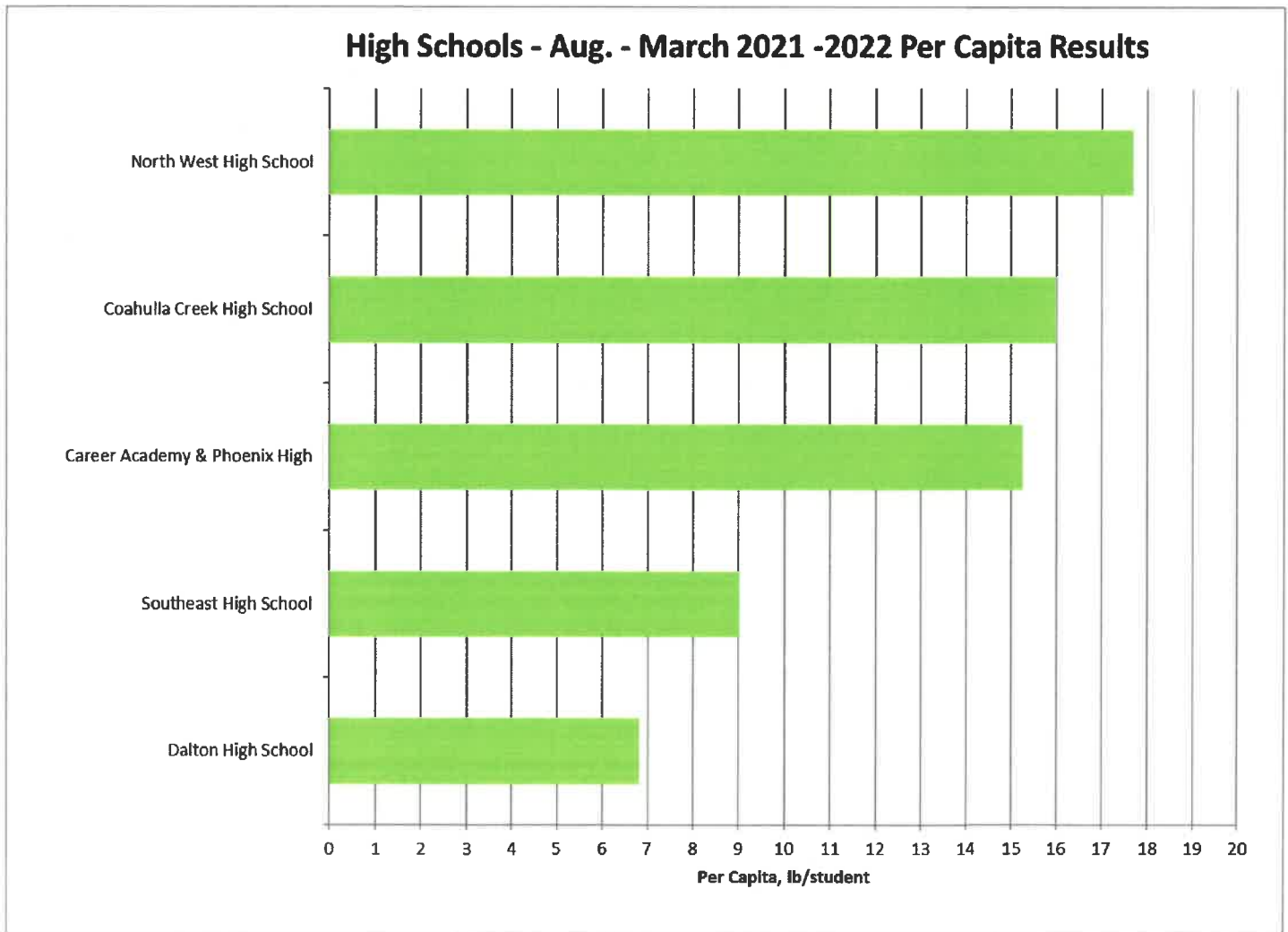
